WHEW, WHAT A YEAR, SAID EVERYONE, EVERYWHERE.

Like so many during the pandemic, we had to reimagine the best way to accomplish our mission. We threw out the playbook, transformed our programming, and sought to discern and join the Spirit of God working in and through the Dane County Church. Despite the incredible challenges, we witnessed the acceleration of churches coming together for the good of one another and the broader community.

A few highlights include:

- Over 20 churches coming together to <u>celebrate Juneteenth</u> by distributing over 90,000 pounds of food
- Clergy from **13 congregations** inviting us <u>together in prayer</u> throughout the year
- 44 Dane County churches represented in attendance at the <u>Kingdom Justice Summit</u> to learn and dream about exuding hope for all people
- 24 pastors enjoying times connecting with God and one another during much-needed <u>rest</u> and renewal retreats



These are just a few examples of the diverse Christian community coming together to build relationships, share resources, and collaborate for the good of all. My hope is that this annual report will help tell the story of what God is up to in our area.




Collaboration Project is doing great work bringing the local church together to better serve the community. I am grateful for the opportunities I've had to partner with them and look forward to what's to come!
